Happy Founders' Day

CU will be celebrating its 132nd anniversary on February 14th, as our Society was founded at a meeting conducted at St. Mary Byzantine Catholic Church in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania on that date in 1892. The GCU is a fraternal benefit society, a membership organization that is legal-

ly required to offer life, health and related insurance products to its members, be not-for-profit, and carry out charitable and other programs for the benefit of its members and the public. The GCU's current "Mission Statement"—"Protecting Families, Promoting Faith and Fellowship, Strengthening Communities" could have certainly been adopted on day one of our Society's founding and has stood the test of time over the course of our 132 years.

Our founders and forefathers would be very proud of what GCU has accomplished in terms of financial success. But the foundation our Society was built upon was not based solely on financial support in time of need. It also included the importance of God, family and the care and love of our fellowman, which in today's society gets placed far too many times on the back burner.

Is it an accident or was there really any thought to the fact that the GCU's founding occurred on Valentine's Day? History gives us no guarantees on the origins of Valentine's Day, but it is known that it contains vestiges of the early Christian church in ancient Rome and a pagan festival. The history records of the GCU makes no mention of the association of Valentine's Day to its founding, but the history publication of the GCU "Opportunity Realized – The Greek Catholic Union's First One Hundred Year's 1892-1992" does note that one of the aims of our Society was to spread love and friendship among the Rusin Greek Catholic people living in America! So, just maybe having this meeting on Valentine's Day created this one aim by our founders!

PRESIDENT CEO REPORT

Today, our Founder's initial aims and vision continue and have been expanded through the GCU's fraternal programming offering financial and volunteer support to individuals, communities, organizations and our Byzantine Catholic Church and other Christian denominations in need. We are now in our second year of the GCU's Fraternal Metamorphosis Program and encourage all of our members to participate in the various volunteer, fundraising and social events sponsored on a national level or by your local Constellation. Please visit the GCU's website – www.GCUusa.com – and click on "Events".

The Fraternal Programming is funded by the GCU's financial strength and success. We are in the process of completing our annual financial statements. Despite the extremely challenging financial and investment markets in 2023, preliminary results project total year end admitted assets of \$2.7 billion a \$63 million or 2.3% increase from year end 2022. Surplus increased \$2 million to \$221 million with net income increasing \$6 million after realized capital losses of \$5 million. The GCU's Chief Financial Officer, Tim Demetres, will be publishing our 2023 year-end report and detailed commentary in the April 2024 Annual Report issue of the *GCU Magazine*.

The GCU was recently reviewed by KBRA (Kroll Bond Rating Agency). We are pleased to report that they reaffirmed our current A- rating with a stable outlook. We invite you to view the press release issued by KBRA on page 9.

In closing, GCU has been blessed over our 132 year history. We must never become complacent and rest upon our laurels. We must constantly be aware of the "ifs" and "risks" ever so constant within the economic and financial markets to assure our society's continued success. I can assure you that your Board of Directors, executive officers and general counsel have and will continually make sound fiscal decisions in the best interest of our members and of the GCU!

Traditional IRA vs. Roth IRA

ndividual Retirement Accounts (IRAs) are popular investment tools that help individuals save for retirement while enjoying certain tax advantages. Two common types of IRAs are the Traditional IRA and the Roth IRA. Let's review the key differences between these two retirement savings options to help you make an informed decision based on your financial goals.

Tax Treatment:

- Traditional IRA: Contributions to a Traditional IRA are typically tax-deductible in the year they are made. This means that the money you contribute is not subject to income tax until you withdraw it during retirement.

Estate Planning:

- *Traditional IRA*: Inherited Traditional IRAs are subject to income tax when withdrawals are made by beneficiaries.
- Roth IRA: Inherited Roth IRAs generally offer tax-free withdrawals for beneficiaries, making them potentially advantageous for estate planning.

Conclusion: Choosing between a Traditional IRA and a Roth IRA depends on your individual financial situation, goals and preferences. Consider factors such as your current and future tax situation, income level and your withdrawal plans during retirement. GCU Board of Directors Election Process & Declaration of Candidacy

Board Election

With the approval of the GCU Referendum in April 2018 eliminating the need for a National Convention, a new election process was developed to elect the ten (10) members of the GCU Board of Directors. Ballots will be mailed to all Adult GCU Benefit Members (18 years of age and older) on Monday, June 3, 2024. Members will have the ability to vote by mail or online, once they have received their ballot. Each vote carries the same weight and there is no proxy voting.

Candidates that meet the following criteria, may submit their Declaration for Candidacy until Monday, April 1, 2024. Declaration of Candidacy forms are available on the GCU website in the Member Events section or can be obtained by calling GCU President/CEO George Juba at 724-495-3400 ext. 3928 or emailing gjuba@GCUusa.com.

Summary of Directors' Responsibilities

As a member of the GCU Board of Directors, a Director is responsible for the effective governance of the GCU. Their main purpose is to advise, govern, set and oversee policy & direction, and assist with the leadership and general promotion of the GCU in support of its mission, strategic vision and core values.

Bylaw Requirements

As per Par. 62 of the GCU Bylaws, all candidates for Director must submit a Declaration for Candidacy & Resume Form for Director together with a digital photograph and comply with the following qualifications:

- (a) A citizen of the United States of America.
- (b) A member of the GCU for a minimum of five (5) years as of January 1 of the election year.
- (c) A person of Slav origin and a Byzantine Catholic for a minimum of five (5) years as of January 1 of the election year.
- (d) Of good moral character, reputation and good American spirit.
- (e) A candidate must have attained the age of 30 prior to January 1 of the election year and not be older than age 77 prior to January 1 of the election year.
- (f) Any other qualifications set forth by the Directors in the Declaration of Candidacy & Resume Form for Director.

Qualifications as set forth by the Board of Directors per Par. 62 (e) are as follows:

- · Must possess a minimum of two of the following:
 - Bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited university.
 - Currently hold (or has held) an executive or C-Suite position for a minimum of five years in the ance, annuity, financial, or fraternal industry.
 - Owns and operates (or has owned and operated) a successful middle market business enterprise for a minimum of five years.
 - Currently employed or has been employed in the financial/insurance industry for a minimum of five years or possess a financial/insurance certification for a minimum of five years.
 - Serve (or have served) as a Director on a professional policy, carver or governance Board for a minimum of five years.
 - Minimum of five years experience in human resources, risk management, cybersecurity or digital marketing.

Expectations of Board Members

- Be committed and possess values that are aligned with the purpose and mission of the GCU.
- · Solid understanding of the GCU's business.
- · Contribute to the improvement of Board Governance though knowledge or skills possessed in one or more of the following areas: policy, finance, organizational strategy, technology, legal, marketing, sales, civic leadership, risk management or personnel.
- · Gain understanding of the GCU's policies and procedures.
- · Become familiar with the GCU's finances, budget, and financial/resource needs.
- Participate on standing committees of the Board and serve on ad-hoc committees, as necessary.
- Prepare for and participate in the discussions and the deliberations of the Board.
- Be alert to community concerns that can be addressed by the GCU's mission, objectives, products and programs. Communicate this to the entire Board.
- Foster a positive working relationship with other Board members.
- Be aware of, and abstain from, any conflict of interest.

Key Responsibilities

Members of the Board shall share these responsibilities while acting in the best interest of the GCU. Each member is expected to make recommendations based on their profession, experience, expertise and vantage point in the community.

- Organizational leadership and advisement.
- Formulation, oversight and governance of policies and procedures developed by the Board.
- Establish overall long and short term goals, objectives and priorities for the GCU.
- · Recommend GCU policy.
- Prepare for and participate in the discussion and the deliberations of the Board.
- Financial oversight, including approval and oversight of the annual operating budget.
- Oversight of program planning and evaluation.
- Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the GCU's annual business plan through a regular review of sales and budget reports as well as a review of products, programs, and services as compared to the market and competitive environment.
- Review of key departmental (finance, membership, sales, marketing, fraternal) plans, budgets and performance reports.
- Promotion, and support thereof, of the GCU's membership and mission through advertising, outreach and community networking.

Meeting and Time Commitment

- The Board of Directors meets quarterly with a minimum commitment of 15-20 days on site annually, not including travel time.
- In addition, Board members are to be available at the call of the Chairperson of the Board for any committee and special meetings. These meetings may be either in person or via teleconference, throughout the year.
- Board members are expected to attend GCU events and meetings.

Term

Directors are elected by the membership to a four-year term beginning on October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2028.

2024 GCU Board Election Timeline

December 2023—Declaration of Candidacy Form available on GCU Website. Election announced in *GCU Magazine*.

February 2024—GCU Board Election announced in *GCU Magazine*.

April 1, 2024—Declaration of Candidacy and supporting documents must be postmarked and sent to GCU Home Office for consideration and approval of Nominating Committee.

May 1, 2024—All applications, upon approval by Nominating Committee, will be submitted to Broadridge Financial Solutions, Inc.

June 3, 2024—Ballots mailed to members.

July 1, 2024—Balloting closes online; mailed ballots must be postmarked and returned.

Christ is Among Us!

ear Friends. The month of February has a great significance for us in the GCU. It was on February 14, 1892, in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, that the GCU was officially established with 743 members. From day one the fundamental goals of the GCU have remained the same: "Protecting Families, Promoting Faith and Fraternalism, Strengthening Communities."

In the life of the Byzantine Catholic Church, February 14th, is also important as we commemorate the repose

of Saint Cyril, Equal of the Apostles, and Teacher of the Slavs. We remember the life of St. Cyril and his brother St. Methodius who by a revelation from God, compiled a Slavonic alphabet and translated the Gospel, Epistles, the Psalter and many Service books into the Slavonic language. They introduced Divine Services in Slavonic. Later on in Rome, Saint Cyril soon fell ill from his many labors, and after taking the monastic schema, he died on February 14th in the year 869 at the age of forty-two.

In our American society February 14th is very much enjoyed by Hallmark, numerous florist and candy companies. We all know why, because on this day we celebrate St. Valentine's Day. What we often forget (and not promote) is that this day originated because of the life and martyrdom of St. Valentine who is recognized as the patron saint of love. As a bishop/priest St. Valentine lived in the 3rd century during the time of great persecution. He was sent to jail for performing weddings for couples during a time when new marriages were outlawed in ancient Rome. Before he was killed for refusing to renounce his faith, St. Valentine wrote a last note to a young child to encourage her to stay close to Christ and to thank her for being his friend. He signed the note: "From your Valentine." That note inspired people to begin writing their own loving messages to people on St. Valentine's feast day, February 14th, which is celebrated on the same day on which this bishop-priest Valentine was martyred.

For many of us, as we will remember the founders of the GCU, St. Cyril, and St. Valentine, it will be the first week of the Great Fast-Lent (for Roman Catholics it will actually be Ash Wednesday). A few days ago, a nice young couple asked me how can they celebrate St. Valentine's Day, since this year it will be for us a day of fast and abstinence. I thought for a moment and jokingly said "Well, for sure no chocolate roses this year!" But then we enjoyed a deep conversation about the Great Fast-Lent, and realizing that at their core, Lent and St. Valentine's Day celebrate the same thing: LOVE. Affectionate, passionate, sacrificial love, personified in the life and death and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The love of St. Valentine and the love of the Great Fast-Lent is sacrificial, putting the needs of others above your own. This couple that I talked with, decided to



share that LOVE with others this year by helping/assisting a charitable organization in our area.

As you read this article, what is your Great Fast-Lent going to be like? What is your St. Valentine's Day going to be like? And yes, the words Great Fast-Lent and romance typically don't go together. But as I said before, at its essence, Lent is all about love. It's about creating more space in our hearts to hear God's voice. It's a time for re-kindling devotion to the Lord, so that we ardently say "Yes" to Him more often in our lives. I like to think of the Great Fast-Lent as a season in which I can fall more in love with God. And therefore, this year take to heart the words of St. John the Baptist, "He must increase, but I must decrease." (John 3:30) How can we do this?

It's true that in our churches, you will be hearing a lot about "prayer, fasting, and works of mercy", and they are and continue to be the three main "ingredients" of the Great Fast-Lent. Even as a child I remember how our house smelled of fish and cabbage during Lent. But in our busy 21st century I wish to encourage you to find silence during the Great Fast-Lent. Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta once said, "We need to find God, and he cannot be found in noise and restlessness. God is the friend of silence. See how nature — trees, flowers, grass — grows in silence; see the stars, the moon and the sun, how they move in silence. We need silence to be able to touch souls."

Finding silence to touch souls, to touch people's hearts. Daily we face constant noise and visual distraction—inces-

sant beeps, vibrations, images, and updates—with all this noise around us, it's hard for us to truly encounter God and the people God has placed in our lives. Fasting from various forms of media can help cultivate more silence in our lives so that we can hear God and SEE the people right around us.

The founders of GCU were able to see the struggles of our people and gathered 132 years ago to establish a fraternal benefit society to assist with love those who were experiencing hardship in their lives. It was love and evangelism that inspired two brothers Ss. Cyril and Methodius to leave their home country and to share their passion for the Gospel and to convince their flock of the love of God. St. Valentine, during the times of persecution, was not afraid to teach his people how to recognize and experience true love.

This Great Fast-Lent, in addition to discerning which sweet you will give up and at which soup kitchen you will serve, find some simple ways to love more deeply in daily life. Find that silence to hear God and to see people around you, because the Great Fast-Lent is about LOVE.


KBRA Affirms Rating For GCU

Insurance Press Release

New York (January 23, 2024)

KBRA affirms the insurance financial strength rating (IFSR) of A- for GCU, a fraternal benefit society domiciled in Beaver, Pennsylvania. The Outlook is Stable.

The rating reflects GCU's continued favorable growth trends in surplus and overall capital base that remain underpinned by its demonstrated, consistent trends of profitability. The company's balance sheet and membership base continue to grow despite a depressed interest rate environment for much of the last decade as well as unfavorable trends in the fraternal industry. GCU has historically successfully demonstrated its ability to adjust crediting rates and maintain relatively healthy spreads. While spreads have compressed more recently, financial results remain favorable. The company remains focused on controlled, strategic growth of its suite of products, particularly its fixed indexed annuity product. Writings of whole life and final expense product continue to increase year over year as well. Balancing these strengths is GCU's noteworthy exposure to spread compression within its legacy annuity block due to moderately high minimum guaranteed crediting rates, particularly given the current rate environment, increased disintermediation risk, and an increasingly competitive landscape. Although manageable, the company's investment portfolio has notable exposure to reinvestment and credit risk; however, the higher interest rate environment provides a more favorable setting to replicate GCU's historical trend of robust returns. GCU's business mix ultimately remains concentrated as reserves are almost entirely interest sensitive. While increased life sales is a strategic focus, material expansion of its geographic reach and diversification of business mix will more likely occur over the medium to long term.

It's Only One Day out of 365 [but this year it's 366]

The following was written by former GCU Editor Frederick M. Petro. He uses an interesting approach to remember the many coincidences associated with one very special date.

In a way every single day of every year has a personality of its own. What we do with each day, or how we spend [or waste] our time each day, or remember important dates in the lives of parents, siblings, or even ourselves—all adds up to what might very well be the definition of a life well lived.

Some dates immediately arouse a sense of importance/ attention/concern from us. Dates like: July 4, December 25, February 14, or September 11.

Let's take a look at one day... in one particular year. The day is February 9, and the year is 1974. It's wintertime and the weather in our area [Western Pennsylvania] was typical, very cold along with a few snow flurries. Richard M. Nixon was President of the USA, but not for long. The Watergate Scandal had been brewing and exactly six months after our focus date, Nixon announced his resignation from office on August 9, 1974.

A loaf of bread cost 35 cents, and for 53 cents you could get a gallon of gas [but you couldn't pump it yourself... not in 1974, that is.] On the entertainment scene, the most popular song was Barbra Streisand's "The Way We Were."

On February 9, 1974 our region as well as many parts of the USA experienced yet another episode of the Oil Embargo, bringing on hardship, inconvenience and downright misery to everyone who waited in long lines at filling stations. For some, the time was all a waste as the owner either ran out of gasoline, or simply closed their business for that particular day before customers reached the pumps.

Having already experienced several Oil Shortages, many of us had devised "plans" to deal with it when we needed to. Plans like: car pools, taking public transportation to work, walking to work or the local store to shop, or if the weather permitted—riding a bicycle to work, shop or whatever.

Now then, you may have already figured this one out... or you're close to it... or you have some pretty good hunches. Fear not, here comes [as the late Paul Harvey would have said] – The Rest of the Story.

February 9, 1974 was the date that Mary Ellen Lucas and Frederick Michael Petro were married at St. John the Baptist Cathedral, located then at Tenth Avenue and Dickson Streets in Munhall, PA.

- St. John's was Mary Ellen's home parish. She was born into it and received the Sacraments of Initiation there.
 She went to parochial school there and remained a faithful parishioner until she and Fred moved to Beaver, PA in 1990.
- Fred was a relative newcomer to St. John's. When he withdrew from Seminary studies in 1971 he became cantor at the Cathedral.
- · But there was a connection with St. John's that he had

no knowledge of whatsoever back in 1974. The church where the couple were married was the second of three St. John's, first known

simply as St. John the Baptist Greek Catholic Church ... then the second church or "Old Cathedral" the church of their marriage, built in 1903... designated a Cathedral in 1926... and serving the faithful until 1993 when the third church, "the New Cathedral" was built.

- It's the first of the three St. John the Baptist Greek [Byzantine] Catholic Churches that we turn to. Built in 1897 it was located in Homestead, PA's second ward. Only in 2002 when my father's sister Suzanna Petro Gonglik visited our home for a combined birthday party [80 years for Mom and 60 years for Father John]—my Aunt Sue who was also my godmother, gave me a large manila envelope filled with papers, old stuff, important looking stuff.
- Why are you giving this to me, I asked Aunt Sue? "Because I trust you," she said.
- I could barely look at those valuables. We had a party going on. We had invited around 40, and expected 25 to come. In reality, we had 85.................................. yes 85 people came. It was Fourth of July weekend... lots of cousins and others were home to visit... others heard about the party and asked if they could come. Fortunately, it was a beautiful day and our neighbors were generously offering tables, chairs, and more. I remember ordering Father John, one of the honorees, "you have to go to the store and buy more food. We don't have enough. Just get whatever you can buy. You know what to get." And he cheerfully obeyed my orders. In short, and I actually said these very words at the end of that day, "This event was one of epic proportion!"
- Aunt Sue's envelope remained in our files until I retired in 2009, and soon thereafter I looked at their contents... original documents from my grandparents Petro. The real deal. And among those archives was the Marriage Certificate of Michael Petro and Suzanna Petruschak at St. John Greek Catholic Church, Homestead, PA in September 1899.
- Thus, as we were married in 1974, it was actually the 75th anniversary year of my grandparents Petro at the very same parish where we were being married. Coincidence, or fate?
- Now back to our "real" story.



- On February 9, 1974 the Divine Liturgy together with the Ceremonial Crowning in Marriage celebration had all invited guests successfully conserving their gasoline supply thus allowing them to attend the wedding service and reception. At the liturgical services Father John Petro was the main celebrant with the Cathedral rector at the time, Msgr. Judson Procyk as one concelebrant, and Father Robert J. Karl, longtime Petro family friend and also Fred's boss at the other half of his job [the Archieparchial Office of Religious Education] as the other concelebrant. Also serving at the altar was Deacon John Kachuba, Fred's longtime and later lifelong best friend.
- I should note that Msgr. Procyk in 1995 became Metropolitan Archbishop of the Byzantine Catholic Church in America... only to have his life and service suddenly end in 2001.
- For the other three clergy, service to our Byzantine Catholic Church would continue uninterrupted for more than 20 years. But the end for all three came suddenly, and eerily close. Beginning with Father Bob in May 2022, then Father John Petro in October 2022, and lastly with Father John Kachuba in February 2023... these three, all best friends since the 1960s, and also best friends of myself, all would be summoned to eternity within a 9 month timespan. What a loss to so many of us. Eternal memory and blessed repose to all of them.

In case you haven't guessed it by now, February 9, 2024 is our 50th wedding anniversary.

So, how did we spend the day February 9, over the past 50 years...

- Most of the time the day was mostly uneventful as we both were at work.
- There were a few trips over the years, but as it was the heart of winter, we were in no hurry to travel.
- But two things did prompt travel on around that date in February

- The first "prompter" came after 1994—the year that we learned how to snow ski. We took up downhill skiing at age 47 and each year we experienced improvement in our basic skills, and a desire to "go a bit further" with the challenge, [but keeping it all in the "safe" range.]
- After about 5 years of skiing locally at Hidden Valley first, then Seven Springs, we had our first trip "out West" to Breckenridge, Colorado. We returned there at least 5-6 times over the next ten years.
- In 2001 the GCU initiated Ski Outings and this new program was entirely under my direction. First at Hidden Valley in the Laurel Mountains of Western PA... then a second outing at Big Boulder in the Pocono Mountains of Northeastern PA... and then a third at Boyne Mountain in the upper part of Michigan's Lower Peninsula [the tourist area around Traverse City, Petoskey, and Charlevoix.]
- With the GCU Outings we would add some extra time for personal travel/vacation, often occurring on our anniversary.

We've had 49 previous years to observe the significance of February 9, 1974. All pleasant [actually mostly pleasant] ones. But February 9 will be etched into our short, long, and all other term memories for obvious reasons.

- On February 9, 2008, very early in the morning, Mom died.
- On February 9, 2010, very late at night, Dad died.
- Then on February 9, 2012, around mid-day, Mary Ellen and I were skiing at Park City, Utah and she had the misfortune of falling and fracturing her pelvis. [Long story, but in short she made a full and successful recovery.] And with that incident, our ski lives came to an end, both of us choosing to retire at age 65 rather than challenging the odds that something not good could happen again.
- Of note... with misfortunes occurring every second year three consecutive times, February 9, 2014 came and went with no issues. ME prepared a turkey dinner as we celebrated our 40th anniversary at home. And we've been happy and healthy [reasonably] ever since.

This year we have no big plans for the 50th, but we've sort of already been celebrating with small, personal celebrations each month. We hope our experiences of the past 50 years brought back a few memories... or a smile to your face... or a remembrance of loved ones along with a prayer or two.

She currently resides in Minneapolis, MN where she creates original works for the stage and screen. Her second evening length work, duet Rock, Paper, Scissors, premiered in March 2023 at the Southern Theater for a 3-night run. This work included Maria Mačošková's rendition of Mamko Moja L'uba from the 2003 concert of Mačošková, Servická, and Sikorjakova. Members from the Rusin Association of Minneapolis were in attendance. GCU Director Maria Silvestri of the John & Helen Timo Foundation lead the talk back the first evening.

Alexandra has twice been a Jerome Hill Artist Fellow Finalist (Jerome Foundation), and in 2021 was named an Ann & Weston Hicks Choreography Fellow at Jacob's Pillow. The Pillow is a world renowned center for dance in the Berkshires. During her fellowship she worked with acclaimed faculty and became a mentee of Andrea Miller/GALLIM dance. In May Alexandra spent 6 weeks in New York City with Miller as she prepared GALLIM for their spring season at the Joyce Theater. During this time Alexandra also served as a production assistant and was thrilled to read her name in the program at such an iconic theater.

Alexandra traveled directly from New York to Prešov, Slovakia to attend the Studium Carpatho-Ruthenorum at the University of Prešov. This





was Alexandra's third time in Slova-kia; her first was with Slavjane Folk Ensemble's European tour in 2005. As an alumnae of the group Alexandra grew up within Pittsburgh's Carpatho-Rusyn community. She loved performing and learning the history of the songs and dances she was taught. Despite all this experience, having the opportunity to formally study the Carpatho-Rusyn language, culture, and history during the Studium was life changing for her. She connected

Alexandra was a recipient of the GCU National Scholarship in 2010. She is the daughter of Paul & Leslie (Begala) Bodnarchuk, who are members of Holy Ghost Byzantine Catholic Church, North Side-Pittsburgh. She is also a granddaughter of the late Michael & Marian (Arendas) Begala, long time members of Holy Trinity Byzantine Catholic Church, Wall, PA. She holds a BFA in Dance Performance & Choreography, and a BA in French from Ohio University.

As a result of the SECURE Act passed in December of 2022, GCU Members with an IRA may do any or all of the following:



- Contribute up to \$7,000 annually (or \$8,000 annually—age 50 or older) for 2024. This is up from limits of \$6,500 and \$7,500, respectively in 2023.
- Contribute to your IRA without an age restrictionaslong as you have earned income.
- Withdraw up to \$5,000 to pay expenses for the birth or adoption of a child, without penalty.

Having earned income is a requirement for contributing to a traditional IRA, and your annual contributions to an IRA cannot exceed what you earned that year.
