As a Student Government Representative, I served on the Activities & Public Relations Committee, where we ran many events to improve student life such as Christmas cookie decorating.

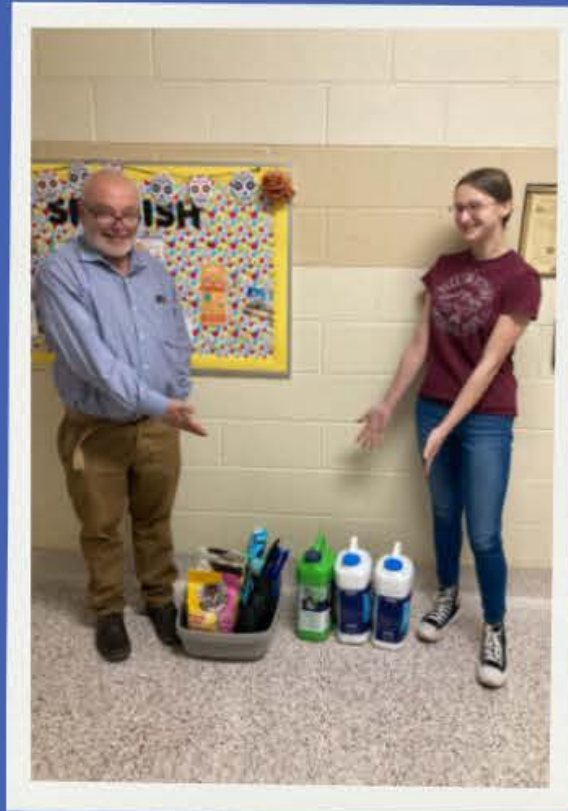

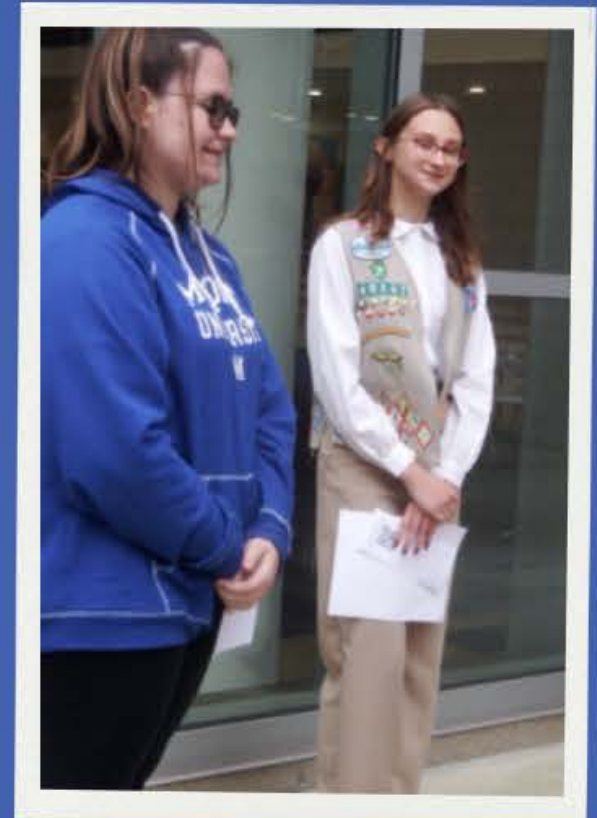


# Scouts

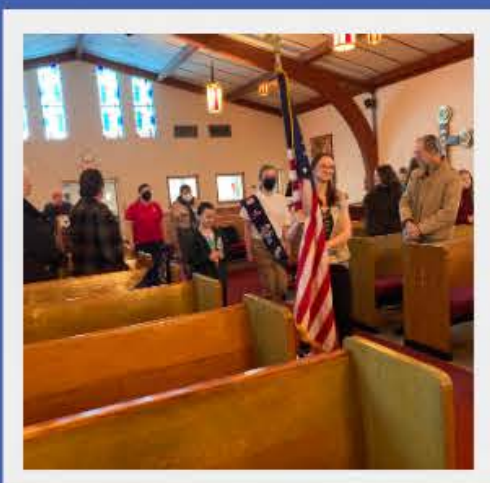
